To be eligible to receive the highest award, a lodge must complete a minimum of ten (10) qualifying community service events. Those lodges completing this level of community service events, will be recognized at the Grand Lodge Annual Communication held in October 2025, and will receive a special plaque for display in your lodge.

The official start of this special year's program was **August 1, 2024** and will end on **July 31, 2025**. All paperwork for the lodge's community service events, must be submitted to Grand Secretary's Office by no later than **August 15, 2025**.

The lodge should submit all events that they believe would qualify as a community service, and the award committee will review and determine if the event meets the qualifications. Please submit your paperwork on an ongoing basis throughout the year . . . please don't wait until August 15 and submit all of your events; the committee will keep a tally.

The paperwork (report) must have the Lodge Name & Number, the date of the event, the location of the event, the time of the event, how many members participated, the name of the chairman of the event, and WHO is benefitting from this community service event.

Fundraisers for charities is not a community service project, however, the presentation of those funds to the community or community organization, will qualify.

Suggested events include: food drives, coat & blanket drives, supplying holiday dinners, volunteering at the Food Bank, Bell Ringing for the Salvation Army, highway cleanup, community/state cleanup events, community blood drive, VA Hospital clothing/supplies drives,

New Lodge Established in Delaware!

For the first time in over 50 years, Delaware has welcomed a brand-new lodge: **Independence Lodge No. 76!**

The idea for this new lodge was introduced during the 2024 annual session of the Grand Lodge of Delaware when then - Grand Master M.:W.: Ronald Ferraro proposed the formation of a daylight lodge in lower Delaware. The goal was to provide an opportunity for brothers who are unable or prefer not to drive at night, as well as those who work night shifts, to remain active in the craft we hold dear. Additionally, the lodge aims to engage the many retirees who have relocated to the area from out of state.

The journey began with three informal meetings, the first of which was held at Jefferson Lodge in Lewes on December 11, 2024. Subsequent meetings took place at various lodges within District Three. By the conclusion of these gatherings, approximately 20 brethren had committed to joining the new lodge. A formal request was then submitted to the Grand Lodge for permission to operate under dispensation.

On March 13, 2025, M.:W.: **James R. Hanby, Sr.**, approved the dispensation, and on March 18, 2025, **Independence Lodge No. 76** held its inaugural meeting at the Temple Lodge No. 9 building in Milford. The meeting was attended by twenty-one members and six visitors. At its inception, the lodge membership included the Grand Master, three Past Grand Masters, the R.:W.: Senior Grand Warden, eleven Past Masters, and seven Brothers, with two additional petitions submitted.

Meeting Schedule:

Independence Lodge No. 76 will convene on the **third Tuesday of each month (except July and August) at 11:00 AM**. During its first year, meetings will rotate among various lodges in District Three.

The next meeting is scheduled for **Tuesday, June 17, 2025, at 11:00 AM at Doric Lodge No. 30 in Millville**. All are welcome to join us in celebrating this exciting new chapter of Freemasonry in Delaware. Lunch will be provided following the meeting. We look forward to sharing in fellowship and brotherhood!

The Jackson 5K Run/Walk welcomed families and casual participants, fostering a sense of inclusivity and community spirit.

The day's efforts culminated in a Volunteer Appreciation Dinner at Jackson Lodge, where Laurie and Brian Souza prepared a delectable meal that fueled laughter, fellowship, and well-deserved relaxation. The event's impact extended beyond the finish line, with proceeds supporting local nonprofits. These funds will be presented to the organizations on stage during the Delaware City Day Festival, amplifying the race series' role as a force for good in the community.

Looking ahead, the Conquer the Canal Race Series is poised to reach new heights in 2026 with the thrilling addition of a Certified Half Marathon! This new race promises to attract even more runners, offering a challenging yet accessible distance for both seasoned athletes and newcomers.
